

National Test Results (SATS)

During their time at Primary School, children throughout England and Wales are tested by reference to National Tests on two occasions - first at Key Stage One - (7 years old), and then again at Key Stage Two (11 years old). We set out the results for the School, compared with the National average.

Key Stage One Results (2017)

At the end of Key Stage 1, children are assessed by their teachers in the subjects below. All figures are shown in percentage. Children achieving Level 2 are regarded as performing satisfactorily for their age, and those achieving higher levels are regarded as better than average for their age. There were 30 children in the cohort. Figures may not total 100 per cent because of rounding.
