Come and See – Celebrating

We will be finding out about <u>Holy Cross church</u> this term. In class, we will be thinking about what a celebration is, the elements of celebration and how people celebrate.

The children will listen to the 'Presentation Story' of Jesus and learn all about Anna and Simeon. The children will also learn how the Parish celebrates

Understanding of the World

This half term our main topic is The History of Toys. We will be finding out about which toys children played with a long time ago. We will also be thinking about the materials that were used to make the toys and comparing them to what toys are like today. We will be



using websites, books and library resources to enrich our learning.

Class Dojo - Portfolios

I will be setting a task for you and your child on Class Dojo. It would be wonderful to hear from your child's grandparents and greatgrandparents - if possible. Perhaps they could share photographs of themselves as children playing with toys, maybe they have kept toys that they could show your children. It would be very exciting for the children to watch a video made by grandparents or greatgrandparents on Class Dojo. Please keep checking Class Dojo for more information.

We will also be finding out about <u>freezing and melting</u>. We will make close observations of the changes we can see. We will use an iPad to take photos of the changes.

Our second topic will be all about floating and sinking. We will make predictions and think about why some materials float while others sink. There will be lots of time to explore materials and carry out experiments.

Literacy

In phonics, we will perform songs with actions, identify body sounds, use our voices to make sounds and move our bodies in response to an instrument. We will also continue to build upon our listening skills. The children will continue to take part in fine motor skills activities so that they can gain control when writing and drawing. They will bring two books home each week, one a library book for you to share and the other a school reading book. Click me for more information. We ask that you share them with your children and return them weekly in their book bags so we can change them. We will encourage the children to continue looking through the books and describing what they see and what may be happening. We will be reading a variety of fact and fiction books this half-term. Some will be linked to our topics, others

How can you help?

- ✓ Children will take a Library Book home each weekplease read and discuss the story with your child.
- ✓ After asking questions about the story, ask your child what they saw, what happened, and what could happen next.
- ✓ Helping your child to form letter shapes from their name. To control the pencil using a tripod grip.
- ✓ Encouraging them to notice colours, shapes,features and things that match.
- ✓ Talking about amounts, sizes and comparing.



Mathematics

- Noticing Making them aware of the maths around them.
- Commenting on features and shapes.
- Naming and matching items.
- Sorting objects, into chosen groups and groups of the children's choosing.
- Comparing amounts
- Comparing sizes.
- Recognising numbers
- Repeating patterns

Physical Development

- Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters and bikes) and ball skills.
- Using a pencil and other tools effectively.
- Considering ways to keep healthy and safe, eat healthy foods and look after our bodies.
- Developing how to manage basic hygiene and personal care needs for themselves, including dressing and going to

- Being a good friend.
- Turn taking and sharing.
- Using our manners.
- Being good at tidying up and looking after our environment.

Physical Development Fine Motor Skills

The children will have continuous access to daily fine motor activities and they will also take part in dough disco, Squiggle whilst you Wriggle and Funky Fingers activities.

Gross Motor Skills

Children will develop their gross motor skills through outdoor play; running, climbing, balancing, crawling etc. They will develop their ability to move safely too, developing core muscle strength, stability, coordination and balance. We will have weekly yoga activities and will be focusing on ball skills this half-term.
