We will also make cross-curricular links to other areas of learning such as art, D&T, PE and ensure that we have a knowledge-rich and ambitious curriculum which teaches the children the depth and breadth of a topic to embed their skills and knowledge in their learning.



Our **Come and See** topics this term are 'Energy', 'Choices' and 'Special Places'.

In 'Energy, we shall be learning about the Ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, thinking about what happened to the apostles and what they saw and felt. We will also be thinking about how we live when using the energy and gifts of the Holy Spirit. In our 'Choices' topic we will look at the stories of the Two Sons and the Prodigal Son as well as looking at our choices and how we

can say sorry and ask for forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In our last topic, 'Special Places', we will be thinking about the special places that we feel God's love, where we can go to feel that love and what those places look like in different countries.

In **English** we shall be reading and linking our writing to our class texts which will be The Egyptian Cinderella by Shirley Climo and The Minpins by Roald Dahl. She shall be learning how to write instructions, including using imperative verbs and adverbs of time to direct the reader. After that we will be writing an autobiography about Ada Lovelace, learning to write in the first person.



We will also focus on our writing by ensuring that all sentences are punctuated accordingly and joining our letters cursively. We shall also be looking at how to improve our writing by using adjectives, a wide range of punctuation and grammar and develop our editing and redrafting skills.

We will continue to work on our spellings, focusing on the year 3 common exception words and year 3 spelling patterns. A big focus will also be on using our spelling knowledge in our writing.



We shall be using our reading **VIPERS** – **V**ocabulary Infer **P**redict **E**xplain **R**etrieve **S**equence - to analyse, improve and support our understanding when reading specific texts in detail.

The children will be exposed to daily reading from the teacher during story and read as a whole class. I will be sending reading books home (coloured book band books). Books will be changed on a Wednesday but the children can change their books

throughout the week if they have finished the selection that they took home.

Please ensure that your child spends <u>at least 10 minutes</u> reading to you each day, and that your child brings their reading books, yellow reading diary and book bags, to school every day.



In **Maths** we shall follow the New National Curriculum but will have lots of fun putting our learning into the context of our topic. Children will be set weekly maths challenges which will be completed in school on a Friday morning which are vital to support their development of speed and fluency in all aspects of math. This is called the Friday Maths Challenge (FMC) and the children are already familiar with this. This will also support their knowledge and understanding and ensure that what they have learnt has been embedded in their long-term memory. We will learn number facts which need to be learnt by heart (for example, recognising and ordering numbers up to 1,000 and the 3,

4 and 8 times table) and the inverse (opposite calculations to check your answers) too. It is extremely important that you support your child with these math concepts at home as these facts will underpin much of the maths this year which they will find much easier to access if they know these facts by heart and quickly, but also if they know how to apply these skills concretely (using objects), pictorially (drawing and writing) and abstractly (off by heart and know how and why you came to the answer). This in turn will then support them with their reasoning and problem-solving skills. This term we will be continuing our fractions topic before moving on to mass and capacity, money, time and shape.

In **History**, we shall be learning about the History of Hucknall and how it has changed. We will learn that mining was a big part of life in Hucknall and that this industry was the reason that more people migrated to live in the village, changing it to become what it is today. We will also look at Lord Byron and his daughter, Ada Lovelace, to find out why they are so well-known around Nottingham.





In Geography, our topic Rainforest, with a focus on

The Amazon Rainforest. We will discover what, where and how big the rainforest is, covering the countries that it covers and where the river runs through. We will also look at how the rainforest is built, including the different layers of the rainforest, the plants that grow and the animals that live their. As a part of this topic we will also find out the effects that deforestation is having on the rainforest and what this could mean for our world and for the animals living in the area.

In **Science** we shall be learning about plants, their requirements for life and growth, the different functions and parts of flowering plants and how water is transported within them. We will also look at the life cycle of plants including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal. After half term our topic will be animals including humans where we will identify the right types and amount of nutrition needed to survive. We will also explore the skeleton and identify how we use muscles for support, protection and movement.

Please ensure that if your child is having a packed lunch, that they include healthy snacks such as fruit or dried fruit, rather than sweet treats such as chocolate and crisps every day.



In **PE** we shall be learning lots of new strategies to help us in our games such as striking and fielding, using different shapes and sizes of bats, throwing, intercepting and stopping balls. We shall also begin our athletics unit practicing our running, jumping and throwing and will continue our swimming unit.

Note: Please ensure that you do not wear earrings on PE days.

Our PE days will be every Wednesday with Mr Priestly and Thursday swimming.

Please could children come to school on their PE days in their PE kits. Please ensure that they are wearing no tracksuits with logos but plain navy jumpers and joggers, or their school jumper/cardigan is also fine and a plain white t-shirt. Thank you.

Please remember to bring your swimming kit in on a Thursday.

Remember to wear your PE kits and suitable clothing for being outside.

Please bring a pair of plimsolls to change into when you come back into the classroom.

#### **Water bottles**

Please could you ensure that your child has a water bottle in school at all times with their names clearly labelled on it. Water bottles will be sent home every night to be returned the next day. Please ensure that water bottles are filled with water when they are returned and I will ensure that the children know how to fill these in class once it becomes empty.

### **Fruit**

The Government no longer provides fruit for children after KS1. If you would like a snack at break time you will need bring it with you in your bag. We are a healthy school and would like to promote healthy eating so please can you ensure your snack is a healthy one.



All homework and spellings will be added to the homework or spellings tab on the class page on the school website in Class 3s tab.

Children are expected to complete a minimum of 30 minutes practise on TTRS each week and 2 games on SpellingShed from the assigned word lists. This will be checked on Fridays. Children who have been unable to complete this (for whatever reason) will be expected to attend Homework Club on Friday lunchtimes at 12.30 to support them with these skills.

The children will be given a few types of homework this year. Please see the list of weekly homework tasks:

- 1) Read at least 3 times a week, at least 10 minutes each time, write a note in their orange diary of how they read and signed by the grown-up they have read to.
- 2) Reading The children will be given reading books and a yellow reading diary which needs to be kept in their book bags and brought to school each day.
  Please read with your child at least 3 times a week.
- 3) Learn your weekly spellings ready for spelling test on Friday. All of the words that have been sent home are words which the children should be able to read, write and apply correctly to their writing by the end of Year 3.

  Spellings will be handed out at the beginning of a half-term which will outline the spellings for each week for that half-term. You will notice that as you move down the spellings grid, words will be repeated. These will be tested in a spelling book which will be kept in school and the scores will be shared with you via an email on Class Dojo. Spellings will be added to the class page on the school website at the beginning of each half-term under the Spellings tab.
- 4) Log onto Spelling Shed to play the games that I have assigned. These may link to our year 3 spellings or retrieval practice from Year 2.
- 5) Come and See Explore Homework once a month I will send a piece of paper with our Come and See homework to mark our new topic. Come and See is our Religious Education Programme of study. This will be sent on a Friday to be returned the following
  - Please ensure that your child writes their name on the back of their work.
- 6) Times Table Rock Stars please log on and practise your times tables. This is a fun way to learn your math facts.
- 7) Knowledge Organisers KOs these will be added to the class page on the school website under the Knowledge Organisers tab at the beginning of each half-term. It will consist of an A4 sheet of paper of information, words or facts about a topic we are learning this term/half-term which will form part of your weekly homework.
  - Knowledge Organisers include basic knowledge of a topic that we would like your child to learn and embed in their long-term memory to enable them to use the skills/vocabulary in lessons and out of school. We will be using these knowledge organisers in lessons to help us learn about certain topics. Each week, I will specific which section of the knowledge organiser to learn via a note of Class Dojo.

It might seem like I have set a lot of homework tasks but some types of homework will be weekly tasks that are on-going such as completing Spelling Shed games, Times Table Rock Stars, reading and learning spellings every week and some, only once a month.


