Holy Cross Primary Catholic Voluntary Academy is a vibrant, caring school community whose mission and motto 'Loved, Valued, Challenged' is reflected in every aspect of school life. It has been at its current site since 1967 but has its origins in Hucknall dating back to 1939.

It has always been a popular school with a family atmosphere and an excellent reputation for attainment, behaviour and politeness.

Innovative and effective learning and teaching strategies are core and school leaders use current research to inform decisions ensuring an effective curriculum.

We have a vibrant, inspiring, dynamic and technological learning environment. It is child-centred and inspires independence.

Learning takes place in a range of settings in and around the school grounds, from the bright, learning centred classrooms, well-resourced inviting libraries, to our outdoor learning environment. This includes a Forest School site, sports pitches, wooden learning pods, trim trails, playgrounds, reading areas and the creative child-led EYFS outdoor 'Forest Kingdom'.

The design of all classrooms provides direct safe access to outdoor learning opportunities providing for the needs of all pupils.

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Our curriculum

Our curriculum based on our motto of Loved, Valued, Challenged that is rooted in Gospel values, Catholic Social Teaching principles, is knowledge rich and ambitious for all our learners.

Our curriculum follows seven themes that will allow our children to develop deeper knowledge and understanding in as they progress through each year group.

Teaching and learning

Our curriculum is enhanced through additional opportunities to engage in individual and group activities. These include:

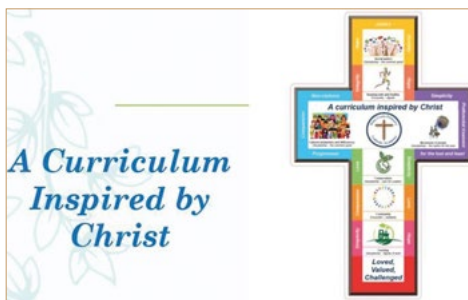
- Instrumental music tuition

Our teachers ensure that every lesson is planned so that pupils can be challenged and supported whatever their ability. Teachers track pupils' progress carefully and use this to inform their day-to-day and medium-term planning.

Every class is supported by a teaching assistant who provides small group and individual support and challenge. They also deliver daily 'subject surgeries' for pupils who may not have fully understood the concept taught in the lesson – helping them for new learning in the next lesson.



Catholic social teaching and British values



Within our school we recognise, not only the importance of helping students to flourish academically but also spiritually, morally, socially and culturally, so they are fully prepared for life in British society and for their role as citizens, able to make the strongest possible contribution to the Common Good of all.

We teach the importance of British values by going much deeper into the meaning of what it means to live a good life, within a framework of Catholic Christian Values. This provides the context and meaning for understanding why British values are important.

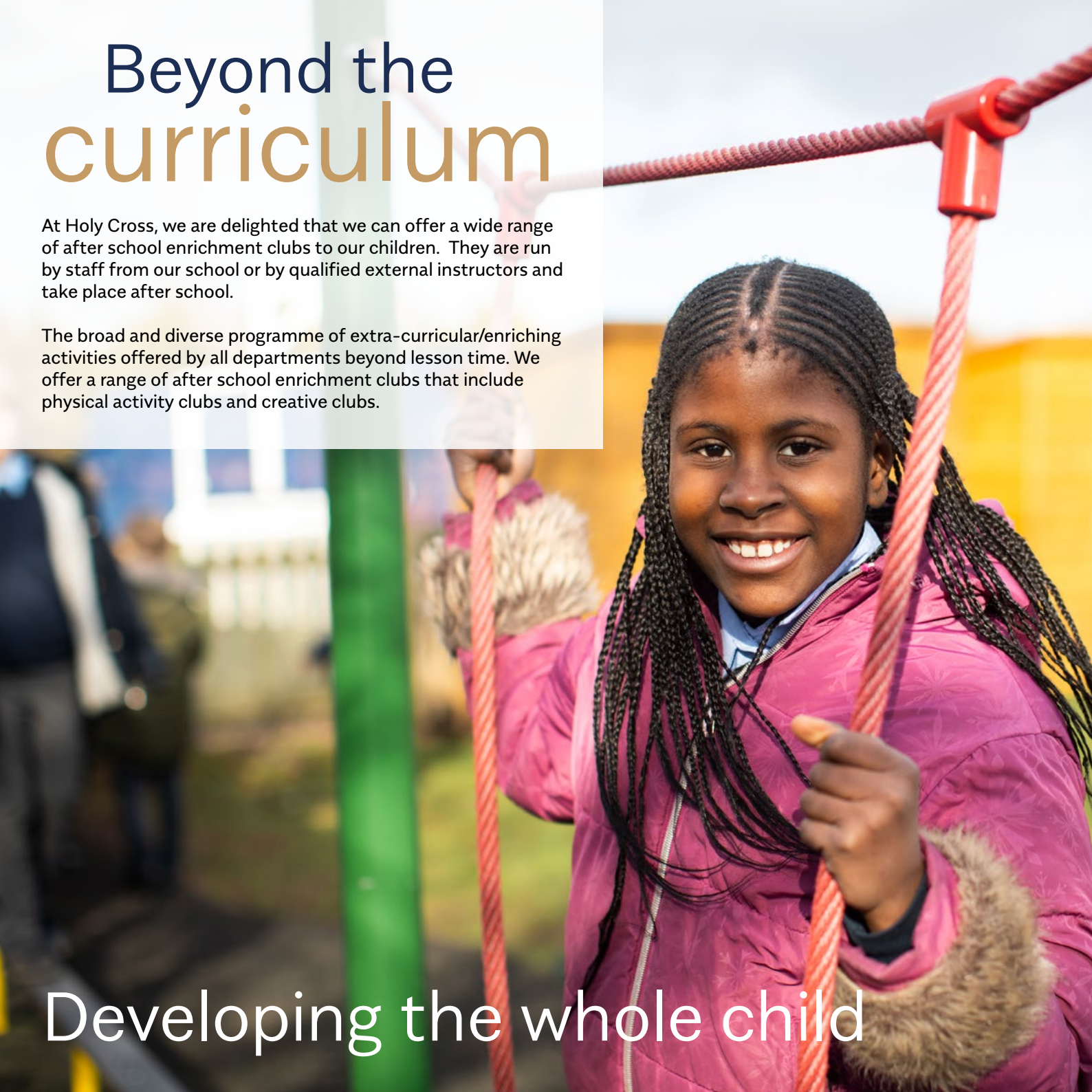
Our framework for understanding British values draws on the example of Jesus and his welcome and inclusion of all, which is developed in Catholic Social Teaching.

Beyond the curriculum

At Holy Cross, we are delighted that we can offer a wide range of after school enrichment clubs to our children. They are run by staff from our school or by qualified external instructors and take place after school.

The broad and diverse programme of extra-curricular/enriching activities offered by all departments beyond lesson time. We offer a range of after school enrichment clubs that include physical activity clubs and creative clubs.

Enrichment activities

We want every child at Holy Cross to participate in our enrichment clubs as we have seen that students who take an active role in the enrichment activities display higher levels of self-esteem, a heightened sense of belonging, increased attendance and develop positive friendship groups. This can help improve the students' moral and social development, health and wellbeing and academic performance. You will see from the range of clubs and opportunities that we have on offer that there really is something for everyone. Forest Schools

All pupils have an opportunity every year to engage with the Forest Schools programme at an age appropriate level as they move through school. Forest Schools is a child-centered inspirational learning process. It is a long-term programme that supports play, exploration and supported risk taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in our beautiful natural and extensive outdoor learning environment.

Sporting activities

Our pupils take part in a wide range of sports both within the curriculum, and through extra-curricular clubs. We recognise that sport should be enjoyed by children at every level, but we also appreciate the value of nurturing a natural and friendly competitive spirit in our pupils. We aim for every pupil to experience pride in representing the school at some point during their time at Holy Cross.

After School Club

At Holy Cross, we are committed to providing a high-quality childcare wraparound care provision for all our children.

Breakfast club is open Monday to Friday during term-time only, (excluding Bank Holidays and INSET Days) and open from 7.15am until 8.45am.

After School Club starts at 3.30pm until 5.45pm.

School holiday provision starts at 8.00am until 5.00pm (excludes Christmas).





Achieving full potential

Our pupils take pride in their faith and live out the Church's teachings through their words and actions. This includes welcoming, including and celebrating pupils who have different beliefs.

They have an acute understanding of what's right and wrong. They achieve happiness through self-respect and respect for others. They embrace and understand their own community and are always curious and interested in the wider community and how they can contribute to a better world for all.

Throughout the year they direct and contribute to our learning environment, acts of worship, charitable activities, fundraising, and celebrations all of which develop the Catholic character of our school and prepare them for their lives beyond the school gates.

'Pupils enjoy a range of opportunities to contribute to the wider life of the school. For example, pupils can act as peer mentors, prayer partners, librarians and 'eco-warriors'. The popular extra-curricular activities also serve to develop pupils' talents and interests. These range from music and sport to gardening and pet care, and many more.
