#### Fine Motor Skills

The children will have continuous access to daily fine motor activities and they will also take part in dough disco and Funky Fingers activities.

#### Gross Motor Skills

## Bringing your child to Nursery

Doors will be opened at 8.45am. Collection times are 11.45am and 3.20pm.

#### School Gates

Open at 8.40 am and close at 8.50 am
Open at 3.20pm and close at 3.35pm

\*\*Nursery parents/carers will be permitted to exit via the main entrance should it take longer to settle your child.

#### **IMPORTANT**

You **MUST** bring your child **directly** into the nursery and **support and encourage** them in hanging their own coat and put water bottles, lunch boxes in the correct place. Afterwards, **support** your child in finding their name card and joining the carpet activity.

Please ensure you have said goodbye properly!

## Change of Clothing

Please send a bag with a set of cleaning clothing, (this does not need to be school uniform) this will **remain in school** - in case we need to change your child's clothing. Make sure your child's name is on their bag for life. Plastic bags/ bags for life only please.

#### Lunch Time

**School meals** must be booked in advance, at least the day before. New starters please email the office with your child's preferences for the first week.

**Packed lunches**, we are a nut free school, please chop grapes in half, and any other food that might be a choking risk. We do not heat up food so please provide food that is eaten cold. Provide items such as sandwiches, wraps or pasta, fruit, yoghurts and cheese for example. School meals are served with a beaker of water and children who have a packed lunch take their water bottles. The children do not need extra drinks in their lunch boxes.

#### Home Time

Morning nursery sessions end at 11.45 am. Please collect your child via the main office entrance.

At the end of the day the gates will open at **3.20 pm** - please collect nursery children first, Reception class, KS1 and KS2 will open their doors at 3.25 pm. The school gates are closed at 3.35pm

**Please do not be late**, if there are unforeseen circumstances you must notify the office as soon as you are aware that you may be delayed.

## **Emergency Contact Numbers**

If you change your contact number please inform the office ASAP. If grandparents, friends or relatives are collecting your children on a regular basis we must be informed about this and also have their contact details. Please ensure you check your phone throughout the day, on a regular basis. We will phone you in an emergency. We will leave a voice message if possible, and send a class dojo message. In case of an emergency, we must be able to contact you or a relative throughout the day.

## Cold Weather, Clothing and Outdoor Learning

Your child needs a coat every day, which is ideally warm and waterproof. Please make sure that all coats, gloves, scarves and hats have your child's name on them. Check your child's jumper and write over any fading names. We do go out all weather and want your children to be able to learn and explore the outdoors as much as possible. If they wear welly boots to Nursery they will also require their school shoes this day for indoor play. You are welcome to send a pair of Wellington boots into school so that the children can change into these should they need to. Please ensure they are clearly named and in a separate plastic bag or bag for life, they can remain at school.



#### Book Bags

We recommend that your child has a named Holy Cross book bag.

Book bags are ideal for your child's library books and they will use this in reception class and beyond.

<u>Please do not put drinks or toys in their book bag.</u>
