Make 2 small groups with snack like raisins or crackers. Put the two groups together and ask you child to count how many snacks there are in total.

Early Years Maths - Topmarks Search

As we prepare to go on trips the children need to know how to walk safely on the pavement, holding hands and crossing the road carefully.

We will learn about the different factors that support their overall wellbeing – sensible amounts of 'screen time 'having a good sleep routine.

We will be finding out how to welcome and value praise for what we have done.

To know how to be confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions and to know how to describe themselves in positive terms and talk about own abilities.

It's important for your child to feel good about their achievements.

This term I will be sending home a WOW moments activity where you can share some stand out moments and progression in development. We would love to see what your child has been getting up to at home.

#### **Understanding of the World**

Past and Present - We will be finding out about toys from the past. We will be comparing old and new toys. During the topic we will think about the materials used to make old toys, like wood, metal and pottery. We will compare this to the modern plastic and electrical toys we see regularly today.

If you have any toys or books that you would like to send in to enrich our topic, I would be very grateful. We will take good care of the things you send in and ensure they are returned to you safely.

The Natural World – We will be finding out about floating and sinking. We will make predictions, test objects, and perform experiments.

We will also be finding out about the Chinese New Year. This year is the year of the snake. We will find out about Chinese traditions and celebrations we will also hear the story of the Chinese Zodiac.

# **Communication and Language**

The children will be listening to stories, rhymes and songs in sessions over this term. They will also be listening to adults read nonfiction books about toys from the past.

The children will be developing their language by giving the toys a voice. They will use the toys as characters and build up story lines. We will try to move the children on from making animal noises or banging toys together. Please support us with this at home by playing with your child and using a storyteller's voice.

The children will be creating their own stories, working in pairs or small groups. As the topic progresses, the children will be learning how to tell their made-up' stories in front of the whole class!

#### **Fine Motor Skills**

The children still need lots of support with fine motor activities at home. Please support them to

- Use a knife and fork correctly.
- Fasten their coats, zips and buttons.
- Use child friendly scissors to cut around curved shapes.
- Use a pincer grip when mark making at home.

Please encourage your child to mark make at home. Ask them to write for a purpose like writing a card to a family member or helping with a shopping list.

#### **Gross Motor Skills**

This term the children will enjoy a unit of gymnastics and a unit on dance. After the half term they will have a unit of learning on games using hoops and quoits, then a unit on dance.

The children will also access large play outside like bikes, using the trim trail and playing playground games.

## **Expressive Arts and Design**

We will be enjoying many different painting experiences like

- Finger painting
- Making paintbrushes from natural materials.
- Outdoor painting

We will also be finding out about collage and transient art.

After the holidays we will be learning about different fruits and vegetables. We will design and make soup. Then we will design our own Holy Cross Soup packaging.

#### **Emergency Contact Numbers**
